

**SUBJECT:** Proposed Changes to YOLOBUS Service in Winters

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**RECOMMENDATION:** That the City Council:

1. Conduct a Public Hearing on the proposed Winters intercity YOLOBUS service changes and new local service for Winters.
2. Approve proposed service changes to establish new local service.
3. Authorize staff to finalize summer and non-summer schedules with YOLOBUS.

**BACKGROUND:**

Over the last few months staff has been working Yolo County Transportation District (YCTD) to explore the establishment of a new local bus service which would better serve our community. The service would be a hybrid of a fixed route with timed pick-ups at Yolo Housing and various stops in Winters and an "on-demand" service for Winters.

**New Local Service**

Route The general path of the new local service's fixed service route is shown is attached. The route was selected to connect Winters neighborhoods and Yolo Housing with community services and amenities such as the pool, planned summer activities, elderly nutrition lunch, parks, shopping, and medical care in Winters. In addition to the fixed route the new local service would shift over to an on-demand (dial-a-ride) service during mid-day and, possibly, late afternoon to serve specific programs such as the elderly nutrition lunch.

Hours During the summer the bus will operate from 10:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on weekdays and 10:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturdays. These hours coincide with the summer youth programs and also provide day time transit to Winters for the residents of Yolo Housing. Once school is back in session the service will operate as on-demand (dial-a-ride) service for 4.5 hours per day Monday - Saturday to serve the needs of the elderly nutrition lunch and provide transit services in Winters and Yolo Housing during the mid-day.
