

1. Ordinance 2017-07, Second Reading and Adoption of Zoning Code Amendments to Prohibit Commercial Marijuana Uses

City Manager Donlevy gave an overview and reviewed the amended ordinance, where the restrictions previously placed on personal cultivation of cannabis outdoors has been removed from the ordinance. With State regulations just now coming out, various aspects of outdoor cultivation will go back to the Planning Commission for further review and will then be brought back to the City Council, hopefully in January.

Winters resident Kathy Woodman said she would like to start her garden in March. City Manager Donlevy said the City will work with her and become educated about outdoor cultivation.

Council Member Biasi said the State will enact laws and the County of Yolo and City of Winters will have their regulations. Council Member Loren said the City will come out with regulations that will be good for our town.

Winters resident John Crespo said 20 minutes before the City Council meeting tonight, the local news reported on the crackdown of illegal grows. We want to do it the right way, the legal way.

SUBJECT: Animal Services Agreement

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council APPROVE AND AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF YOLO AND THE CITY OF WINTERS FOR ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES.

BACKGROUND:

Since the 1970's, the City of Winters along with the cities of Davis, Woodland and West Sacramento have contracted with the Yolo County Sheriff's Office for Animal Control Services. This includes the combination of shelter, field services and licensing for dogs and felines.

Discussion:

The contract agreement with Yolo County runs in a two year cycle and is up for renewal. The \$43,983 and will increase to \$55,958 in FY 2017-18 and \$57,637 in FY 2018-19. The increase in the current fiscal year is 21% and an additional 3% in the next. Included in the cost is the City's proportionate share of a \$22,500 in the exploration of the potential construction of a new animal shelter facility, which is \$750.

The City represents approximately 3.2% of the total operational costs for Animal Services.

Staff is recommending approval of the agreement.

FISCAL IMPACT: \$55,958 in FY 2017-18 and \$57,637 in FY 2018-19.

Subject: Animal Services Contract for FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-2019

Enclosed for your consideration is a two year agreement for Animal Control Services for fiscal years 2017-18 and 2018-19, July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019. Annual compensation to be paid by the city is \$55,958 for FY 17-18 and \$57,637 for FY 18-19, an increase of \$11,975 over prior year and a 3% increase added for the second year of the agreement. There is an overall increase to the Animal Services program of about \$189,233 with no new items added just the cost of doing business. The current agreement also includes the share cost of \$22,500 for the next phase of the exploration of building a new shelter.

Also for your review is the detail behind the percentage split cost of the Animal Services program. The Yolo County Sheriff's Office used current year usage of the program to update use. City of Winters' needs have gone up from 2.1% to 3.2% use of Animal Services.

YOLO COUNTY AGREEMENT NO. _____

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF YOLO
AND THE CITY OF WINTERS FOR
ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES**

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this 1st day of July, 2017, by and between the County of Yolo, a political subdivision of the State of California, ("County") and the City of Winters, a municipality under the laws of the State of California, ("City").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City has a need for animal control services within its corporate limits; and

WHEREAS, the County has been competently providing these animal control services for the City for several years; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to have the County continue to provide animal control services within the City's corporate limits subject to the terms of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County is willing to continue to provide animal control services within the corporate limits of the City subject to the terms of this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and the County agree as follows:

I. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY

A. Subject to the terms of this Agreement, the County shall provide animal control services, through the Animal Control Division of its Sheriff's Department, within the corporate limits of City.

Services provided shall include:

1. The pickup of stray animals not in the presence of their owners that may be injured or sick and the provision of veterinary care per Penal Code section 597(f).
2. The provision of rabies control, including the quarantine of biting animals and the pickup of high-risk rabies animals for testing and licensing per Health and Safety Code sections 120210-121690.
3. Assistance to the Yolo County Coroner, fire departments, or other law enforcement agencies.
4. Response to vicious animals.

- 5. Response to free roaming or contained stray dogs.
- 6. Services provided by the County shall be limited as follows:
 - a. Response to Animal Complaint Reports such as barking dogs, trespassing animals, crowing fowl or other nuisance complaints will be limited to receiving and forwarding complaints.
 - b. The County will not respond to calls regarding animals classified as wildlife unless there is a bat, skunk, or a rabies control issue.

B. Services shall be limited to 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., six days a week, Monday through Saturday. Services will be provided outside these hours only when authorized in advance by a representative of the City, except when required by Health and Safety Code sections 121595 and 121600 or Penal Code section 597f.

C. The County agrees to maintain its kennels and animal shelter in a sanitary condition at all times in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

D. The County shall provide all facilities, equipment, personnel, labor, supervision, supplies, and materials necessary to provide the animal control services required by this Agreement; however, in all instances where special supplies, stationary, notices, forms and the like must be issued in the name of the City, the same shall be supplied by the City at its own cost and expense.

II. COMPENSATION TO BE PAID BY THE CITY

A. The City agrees to compensate the County annually, on a quarterly basis, the following amount:

07/01/2017-06/30/2018	\$ 55,958	\$ 13,989.50
07/01/2018-06/30/2019	\$ 57,637	\$ 14,409.25

B. Quarterly payment is due and payable by check within the first 30 days of each quarter to prevent contract termination.

C. Hourly Rates – The County may bill the City, in addition to the annual agreed compensation, an additional hourly fee for extraordinary incidents. An “Extraordinary Incident” is defined as an incident that requires more than 10 county staff hours. The hourly rate for Extraordinary Incidents is \$59.00 per hour. The County will bill these charges quarterly.

D. Savings – Any unspent portion of annual payment resulting from unanticipated animal services savings will be placed in an “Animal Services Trust” for future shelter projects, animal services equipment and/or replacements items. Savings will be identified within the “Animal Services Budget Forecast” due to the City from the County.

In further consideration of the rendition of the foregoing services by the County, the City agrees that the County shall be entitled to any and all license and other fees provided for in the Yolo County Code and/or the Municipal Animal Ordinance and collected. Should the revenue collected from licensing within the City’s jurisdiction exceed the anticipated fiscal year amount of \$18,295, the final quarter payment due to the County from the City shall be adjusted accordingly.

E. County shall retain all impounding fees and revenue derived from the adoption and redemption of animals at the County shelter as reimbursement for the care and feeding of these animals.

III. REPORTS

The County shall provide the City with monthly and year-end statistical reports regarding field hours, calls, citations, adoptions, redemptions, licenses, and such additional information, as the County deems appropriate. In addition, the after-hours callout dispatch records will be attached with the monthly statistics for review. No charge will be made for these materials.

IV. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS AND WORK PRODUCTS

All professional and technical documents and information developed under this Agreement, and all work products, including writings, work sheets, reports, and related data, materials, copyrights and all other rights and interests therein, shall remain the property of the County.

V. RECORDS RETENTION

The County agrees to keep such books and records concerning the services it provides pursuant to this Agreement in such form and manner as the County Auditor may specify. These books and records shall be open for examination by City officials at all reasonable times.

VI. TERM AND TERMINATION

A. The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2017 until June 30, 2019, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided.

B. This Agreement may be extended for a period of one year based on mutual agreement of the County and City staff.

C. Should either party fail to substantially perform its obligations in accordance with this

Agreement, the other party may notify the defaulting party of such default in writing and provide not less than 15 days to cure the default. Such notice shall describe the default, and shall not be deemed a forfeiture or termination of this Agreement. If such default is not cured within said fifteen-day period (or such longer period as is specified in the notice or agreed to by the parties), the party that gave notice of default may terminate this Agreement upon not less than 15 days' advance written notice. The foregoing notwithstanding, neither party waives the right to recover damages against the other for breach of this Agreement.

D. This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party at any time during the term of this Agreement, provided that 30 days' written notice is given.

VII. APPLICABLE LAWS

In the performance of the services required by this Agreement, both parties shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and County statutes, ordinances, regulations, directives and laws. The laws of the State of California shall govern the validity, enforceability or interpretation of this Agreement. Any action or proceeding arising out of this Agreement shall be filed and resolved in a California State court located in Woodland, California.

VIII. NOTICE

A. Any notice necessary to the performance of this Contract shall be given in writing by personal delivery or by prepaid first-class mail addressed as provided below:

If notice is given by personal delivery, notice is effective as of the date of personal delivery. If

notice is given by mail, notice is effective as of the day following the date of mailing or the date of delivery reflected upon a return receipt, whichever occurs first. If notice is given by facsimile notice is effective as of the time of confirmation of transmission.

C. Either party may change the address or facsimile number to which such communications are to be given by providing the other parties with written notice of such change at least 15 calendar days prior to the effective date of the change.

IX. AMENDMENT

This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by the County and the City.

X. WAIVER

Any failure of a party to assert any right under this Contract shall not constitute a waiver or a termination of that right, under this Contract or any of its provisions.

Each party shall indemnify, defend, protect, hold harmless, and release the other, their elected bodies, officers, agents, and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses, proceedings, damages, causes of action, liability, costs, or expense (including attorneys' fees and witness costs) arising from or in connection with, or caused by any negligent act or omission or willful misconduct of such indemnifying party. This indemnification obligation shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages or compensation payable to or for the indemnifying party under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

XI. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the City and the County and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, whether written or oral. In the event of a dispute between the parties as to the language of this Agreement or the construction or meaning of any term hereof, this Agreement shall be deemed to have been drafted by the parties in equal parts so that no presumptions or inferences concerning its terms or interpretation may be construed against any party to this Agreement.

SUBJECT: Second Reading and Adoption of an Ordinance to Amend Winters Municipal Code §2.52.100 “Level 1 Reserves—Eligibility Determination”

RECOMMENDATION:

Second reading and adoption of Ordinance 2017-04 to amend Winters Municipal Code §2.52.100 “Level 1 Reserves—Eligibility Determination.”

BACKGROUND:

This ordinance came to the Council for first reading on September 19, 2017. It is returning for second reading and adoption at this meeting.

The Winters Police Department supports a non-paid Reserve Police Officer program to supplement the full-time police force and provide a possible conduit towards full-time employment with the Police Department.

Although it is difficult to recruit and retain Reserve Officers due to stringent training requirements, the Reserve program currently has three Level I Reserve Officers. Level I Reserves have full powers of arrest while on-duty, but their authority extends only for the duration of the assignment to specific police functions [Penal Code section 830.6(a)(1)]. However, a Level I Reserve may be granted full powers and duties of a peace officer, as provided by Penal Code §830.1, by authority of a city ordinance or a county resolution [Penal Code §830.6(a)(2)]. This is known as a “designated” Level I

Reserve and Winters Municipal Code §2.52.090 “Level 1 Reserves—Powers and Duties—Statutory Authority” provides for this classification. Currently, we do have one “designated” Level I Reserve, whose duties are primarily with the Yolo County High Tech Unit.

Due to the language of Winters Municipal Code §2.52.100 “Level 1 reserves—Eligibility determination,” Reserve Level I’s *“shall”* be granted “designated” status after meeting certain criteria. This mandate is not a requirement of the state statute. Further, not all Level I Reserves need, nor should, be granted “designated” Level I status and this determination should be at the discretion of the Chief of Police. Therefore, staff recommends amending Winters Municipal Code §2.52.100 “Level 1 reserves—Eligibility determination” to remove the language mandating appointment to “designated” Level I status and, instead, reflect that this determination shall be at the discretion of the Chief of Police.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-04

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINTERS,
AMENDING WINTERS MUNICIPAL CODE §2.52.100
“LEVEL I RESERVES – ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATION”**

WHEREAS, the City of Winters enacted Winters Municipal Code §2.52.090 “Level 1 Reserves—Powers and Duties—Statutory Authority” and §2.52.100 “Level 1 Reserves—Eligibility Determination” to fulfill the statutory requirements of California Penal Code §830.6(a)(2) in appointing “designated” Level I Reserve Police Officers; and

WHEREAS, Winters Municipal Code §2.52.100 “Level 1 Reserves—Eligibility Determination” mandates the appointment of “designated” Level I Reserve Police Officers after meeting certain criteria and this mandate is not a requirement of the state statute as codified in California Penal Code §830.6(a)(2); and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to modify Winters Municipal Code §2.52.100 “Level 1 Reserves—Eligibility Determination” to reflect that the determination to appoint “designated” Level I Reserve Police Officers should be at the discretion of the Chief of Police”;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINTERS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are adopted as findings of the City Council as though set forth fully herein.

SECTION 2. Winters Municipal Code §2.52.100 “Level 1 reserves—Eligibility Determination” is hereby amended to read as follows:

Title 2

ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL

2.52.100 Level 1 Reserves—Eligibility Determination.

Those City of Winters police reserves who have qualified as Level 1 reserves pursuant to Penal Code Section 832.6(a)(1) and, in addition, have completed the California P.O.S.T. approved Field Training Program comprising of a minimum of four hundred (400) working hours with the Winters Police Department, or as was hired as a qualified lateral Level 1 police reserve officer from another California P.O.S.T. agency, may be granted peace officer powers and duties as provided by Penal Code Section 830.1 in accordance with Penal Code Section 830.6(a)(2) at the discretion of the Chief of Police.

SECTION 3. If any provision, section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance

is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutionally by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, or its application to other persons or circumstances. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed and adopted each provision, section, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, paragraphs, subparagraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that City Council authorize City Manager to execute amendment to consultant services agreement 017-01H with Harris and Associates in the amount not to exceed \$18,850 to continue with the next phase of Preliminary Investigation and Engineering to underground utilities on Newt's Expressway (alley).

BACKGROUND: Council approved a \$5000 contract with Harris and Associates on May 2, 2017 for support services in undergrounding the utilities in Newt's expressway. These improvements would allow the City to change the utilitarian function of the current alley to an enhanced Paseo and Pocket.

At this time we are only moving forward on phase one as detailed in the proposal dated October 23, 2017 in the amount of \$18,850. The additional work specified in phase two as noted in Harris' proposal in the amount of \$56,460 will come back for approval at a latter date. Phase two expenses would be reimbursable from Rule 20A and B funds. The phase one cost will be paid out of Street Capital funding.

We propose a fee of \$56,460 (Exhibit C) to bring the project to the Resolution of Intention stage. As we receive more clarity on the boundaries of the project, the utility rule application and the amount of work the utilities will perform, we can provide our fee for the remaining tasks.



- 5 Review submittals presented by Harris and render decisions within a reasonable time, and give prompt notice to Harris at any time the City observes or otherwise becomes aware of any error, omission, or defect in the project.
- 6 Make all necessary provisions for Engineer to enter upon public and private property as required in the performance of the services under this agreement.
- 7 City to stamp plans as needed.

Services and Information to be Provided by Harris

- 8 Basic base map in Phase 1
- 9 Fee is based on the following project limits (approximated):

- 10 Fee includes preparing of up to 12 individual schematic lot plot plans to be used by property owners for service conversions
- 11 **Hours and fee subject to adjustment during scoping session with the City.**
- 12 Hours and fee for individual tasks are a guide; the total hours and cost for the project take precedence.
- 13 Hours and fee may be renegotiated if the project is delayed by factors beyond Harris' control.
- 14 Utilities will design their own relocations, if needed.
- 15 The number of budgeted meetings is indicated on the spreadsheet.
- 16 Final Composite Joint Trench Plans will utilize new aerial topography with supplemental topo based on field survey. Plans to be at 1" =20' scale
- 17 Fees shown are base on for 2017 standard rates and may change in 2018.
- 18 Prepare and distribute addenda via email to the plans and specifications.
- 19 Coordination with PG&E, AT&T and Wave during Phase 2
- 20 Environmental services are not included in fee.
- 21 Perpetuating existing monuments can be provided for an additional cost.

Phase 1: Preliminary Investigation - Initial Estimate

- A. **Kick-off Meeting.** Harris will conduct a kick-off meeting with the City staff to review the project and our plan. Harris will also request any information the City may have of specific areas to review.
- B. **Verify Boundaries with Utility Companies.** Harris will walk the project with the affected utility companies to determine the project boundaries.
- C. **Prepare Boundary Map.** Harris will utilize the conceptual plan and walk to create a boundary map for the undergrounding district.
- D. **Verify Tariff Application with Utility Companies.** Since this project is proposed to be done under several utility rules (electric Rule 20A, Rule 20B, telephone 32.1, 32.2), Harris will meet with the utility companies to confirm the application. Harris will also meet with the utilities to determine if the City can take a lead in preparing the trench composite plans and the reimbursement from the Rule 20A allocation.
- E. **Prepare project schedule.** After meeting with the utility companies, Harris will prepare an overall project schedule.
- F. **Preliminary Cost Estimate.** Harris will utilize unit costs from past undergrounding projects and information from the utility companies to prepare a preliminary cost estimate. The estimate will have an intended accuracy of +/- 50% and include a 30% contingency.
- G. **Prepare Petitions.** Harris will assist the City in preparing the petitions for the assessment district.
- H. **Meetings.** Two meetings with the City are budgeted.

Phase 2 - Preliminary Engineering

- A. **Field Review, Research, and Data Collection.** During this task, Harris will perform our field investigation noting areas available for boxes, pads, and vaults; and review possible locations for riser poles. Harris will also request utility maps from the utility companies.
- B. **Create a District Methodology Report.** Harris will create an assessment methodology report. The report will include the factors that will be utilized in the assessment formula.
- C. **Develop a Base Map (Intent Plans – 35% Submittal).** Harris will utilize information from the field review to create a base map and propose a preliminary trench route (intent to utilities). This will be a 35% submittal.
- D. **Utility Coordination.** Using the base map as a submittal to the utilities, Harris will work with the utilities to develop a preliminary design and cost estimate.
- E. **Evaluate Estimated Costs from Utilities.** Harris will review utility requirements and fees and compare to other similar projects.
- F. **Revise 35% plans with Utility Input.** With input from the utilities, Harris will update the 35% plans.
- G. **Prepare Estimate based on 35% plans.** Harris will prepare an updated estimate incorporating input from utilities and including trench, conduit and enclosures, assessment costs, and permitting. The estimate will have an intended accuracy of +/- 30-40% and have a 30% contingency.

- H. **Develop Assessment Database.** Harris will utilize information from the County to develop the assessment database, updated Boundary Map, and Assessment Diagram for the District.
- I. **Property Owner Meetings.** Prior to modifying the preliminary assessment methodology, Harris will meet with property owners to review the prior assessment methodology, answer questions, and listen to their concerns. (One meeting)
- J. **Prepare the Draft Preliminary Engineer's Report and Diagram.** Harris will update the Preliminary Engineer's Report to reflect any changes in the assessment methodology and the boundaries of the District. The report will also be updated to confirm that it complies with the requirements of Proposition 218.
- K. **Council Meeting - Preliminary Approval.** Attend council meetings to receive preliminary approval. (One meeting)
- L. **Revise Engineer's Report as Requested by Council.** If required, the Engineer's Report will be revised to include any changes requested by the City Council.
- M. **Prepare Boundary Map.** Harris will coordinate the filing of the Boundary Map Diagram.
- N. **Mail Notices.** Prepare the Notices of Public Hearing and Assessment Ballots, including the property owner's name and mailing address, Assessor's parcel number and preliminary assessment amount for mailing to all assessed property owners of record within the proposed District. Work will be performed in accordance with the 1913 Act and Proposition 218. The City will provide the envelopes and postage for mailing. Harris will prepare a written declaration that this task has been completed. Our team will handle all property owner inquiries regarding the Assessment District and coordinate issuance of replacement ballots, as requested by the property owners.
- O. **Property Owner Informational Meetings.** Harris will facilitate one property owner informational meetings.
- P. **City Council Meeting.** Harris will attend council meeting as requested to respond to questions from the council or the public and tabulate the ballots.
- Q. **Finalize Assessment Diagram and Notice of Assessment.** Harris will finalize the assessment diagram and work with the City on the Notice of Assessment.

At this point, the Resolution of Intention is passed and detailed design for the undergrounding district can begin. We will propose a fee for the remaining work once the boundaries are defined and there is agreement with PG&E of the trench lead role.

Phase 3: Final Engineering Report and Design after Balloting (TO BE DETERMINED WHEN BOUNDARIES AND TRENCH LEAD ARE DEFINED)

- A. **Prepare Confirmed Engineer's Report.** Harris will prepare the confirmed Engineer's Report. The Engineer's Report will include the assessment spread and the approved final estimate of costs to be financed, including incidental and financing costs. Harris will prepare the Notice of Assessment, List of Assessed Property Owner Names, and Assessment Diagram for recordation and record.
- B. **Final Engineer's Report and Recordings.** Harris will prepare the Final Assessment Report and coordinate the filing of the Boundary Map with the County Recorder for the District.

- C. **30 Day Cash Collection.** Harris will prepare the Notice of Assessment, including the confirmed assessment amount as well as cash payoff amount for mailing to all assessed property owners of record within the confirmed District. The City will provide the envelopes and postage for the mailing. Harris will handle all property owner inquiries regarding the Assessment District payoff process and coordinate issuance of replacement notices, as requested by property owners.
 - D. **Attend Council Meeting.** Harris will attend the City Council meeting at which Resolution of Intent and Preliminary Engineer's Report are considered and the Public Hearing is set. (1 meeting)
 - E. **Bond Sale Assistance.** Harris will assist the City and project team with review of the Preliminary Official Statement and the Official Statement, and provide basic assessment engineering, as necessary, to bring the project to the point of initial bond sale.
 - F. **Miscellaneous Council and Staff Meetings.** Harris will attend up to two meetings during the formation of the District. Our team will participate in meetings with City staff and project administration.
 - G. **Prepare New Topographical Surveys and Base Maps.** The aerial surveyor will perform the survey, the ground surveyor will identify the right-of-way, the geotechnical consultant will determine if rocks are present in the area, and the utility surveyor will identify the location of existing underground facilities. Harris will also identify the location of existing street lights.
 - H. **Geotechnical Investigation.** Harris' geotechnical subconsultant will perform borings in strategic locations to determine subsurface conditions.
 - I. **Prepare Composite Bid Plans and Bid Documents (65% Submittal).** With input from the utilities, Harris will prepare the composite plans. This will be the 65% submittal for utility and City review.
-
- Since this is a Rule 20B project, a Form B will not be needed as the responsibility for the trench, conduits, and substructures falls on the District.
- J. **Prepare Individual Plats and Coordinate with Property Owners.** Individual plats will be prepared to describe the service route from the meter to the joint trench. These will be in a form that can be provided to the property owners. Harris will coordinate the proposed route and discuss facility locations with property owners.
 - K. **Coordinate Utility Company Review.** Harris will work closely with the utility companies to resolve issues and keep the project moving forward.
 - L. **Revise Composite Bid Plans and Bid Documents (95% Submittal).** Harris will revise the composite bid plans and bid documents with input from the utility companies and will revise the composite plans. This will be the 95% submittal to the utilities and the City.
 - M. **Final Utility Company Review.** Harris will request that the utility companies sign-off on the plans confirming their acceptance.
 - N. **Finalize Plans, Specifications, and Estimates (Final Submittal).** Harris will provide final plans, specifications, and an engineer's opinion of probable construction cost.
 - O. **Perform Bidability and Constructability Review.** Harris will provide a bidability and constructability review with our in-house construction management team.
 - P. **Prepare Right-of-Way Acquisition Documents.** Harris will work with the City and provide 12 easement documents.

- Q. **Advertise for Bids.** Harris will work with the City to prepare the reports to council and upload the bid documents on to the website.

The fees on the schedule are too high, and need to be adjusted down. This was a simple oversight on staff's part, and is supported by the fee study completed by the consultant.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council receive and file the City of Winters Treasurer Report for October 2017.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Winters financial policy requires monthly reports regarding receipts, disbursement and fund balances be submitted to the City Council for review. Items of note in the attached report are as follows:

General Fund

General Fund revenues are 14% of budgeted; the following items affect the cash flows into the General Fund.

- The first installment of Property Tax will be received in January 2018.
- The first installment of Property Tax in lieu of VLF will be received in January 2018.
- Sale and use taxes are remitted to the City two (2) months after they are received by the State Board of Equalization, we have received approximately 15% of projected revenues.
- Utility User Tax is received approximately 1-3 months after the utilities are used; UUT receipts are 27% of the budgeted amount.
- Building permit fees received are 13% of the budgeted amount.
- General Fund expenditures are 37% of budget.
- Current Cash Balance for the General fund shows as overdrawn, however, due to the issue that we don't receive our major funding until 7 months throughout the year, we utilize the Service Reserve Fund and the Capital Equipment Fund to provide cash flow until the property tax amount is received. The total cash balance in these 2 reserve funds is

\$1,083,029. All Staff has been told to only purchase items absolutely necessary for operations at this time.

Other funds:

Fund 211 City Wide Assessment District: The first installment of the City Wide Assessment will be received in January 2018 at the same time that we receive the property tax distribution from Yolo County.

Fund 611 Water: Water fund revenues are 51% of budget and expenditures are 39% of budget.

Fund 621 Sewer: Sewer fund revenues are 31% of budget and expenditures are 36% of budget.
