# Introduction to SB 1383

## SB 1383 Requirements

- Section 18992.2 Edible Food Recovery Capacity requires Counties, in coordination with jurisdictions and regional agencies located within the county to:

(a) Estimate the amount of edible food that will be disposed by commercial edible food generators.

Identify existing capacity at food recovery organizations.

Identify proposed new or expanded food recovery organizations & services that is necessary to recover the edible food that is estimated to be disposed by commercial edible food generators.

# Introduction to SB 1383

## SB 1383 Requirements

- Section 18992.2 Edible Food Recovery Capacity requires Counties, in coordination with jurisdictions and regional agencies located within the county to:

Completed by TCM Edible Food Recovery Capacity Study.

(b) Consult with food recovery organizations regarding existing, or proposed new and expanded, capacity. City staff is working with RISE, Esparto, to bring an edible food recovery & distribution program to Winters.

# Introduction to SB 1383

## SB 1383 Requirements

- Section 18992.2 Edible Food Recovery Capacity requires Counties, in coordination with jurisdictions and regional agencies located within the county to:

(c) If new and expanded capacity is needed to recover the amount of edible food identified (this was established by the TCM Study), then each jurisdiction within that county that lacks capacity shall: Submit an implementation schedule to demonstrate how it will ensure there is enough new or expanded capacity to recover the edible food currently disposed of by commercial edible food generators.

# Introduction to SB 1383

## SB 1383 Requirements

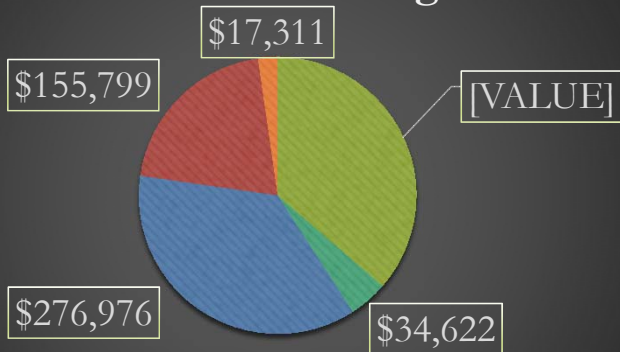
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- Section 18992.2 Edible Food Recovery Capacity requires Counties, in coordination with jurisdictions and regional agencies located within the county to:

Obtain funding for edible food recovery infrastructure to financially support the expansion of edible food recovery capacity.

# Capacity Study Results

## Edible Food Recovery Year 1 Funding

# Partner with 9 Food Recovery Organizations

1. Recommend Tier 1 generators work with the 9 food recovery organizations highlighted in capacity study:

- These 9 organizations already use Feeding America guidelines and have existing capacity available.
- Yolo County Environmental Health (EH) approved for food handling.
- List is not static and other organizations can be added at anytime with EH approval.

2. Fund the expanded capacity for these 9 food recovery organizations in the estimated amount of \$375,000 after review and approval by the jurisdictions.

# Countywide Collaboration

3. Yolo County to create a Regional Edible Food Recovery MOU to identify jurisdictional roles, responsibilities and division of expenses.
