2. DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. City Admin Updates/Items

City Manager Trepa provided an update on the City's efforts to retain the architect who created the original plans. Commissioner Lowden asked how long the CDBG grant period is to complete construction. City Manager Trepa said five years.

2. Community Liaison Reports

- a. Yolo County Commission on Aging

Marlene Bell gave an update on the County's recent meeting including Emergency Go Kits, the emergency alert system and link to Yolo County Power Outages resources: <https://www.yolocounty.org/government/general-government-departments/office-of-emergency-services/emergency-preparedness-resources/power-outage>; she also gave an update on personnel changes and County Covid rates. She provided phone numbers for the County's in-home vaccination program: English-530-902-3230, Spanish-530-379-3465, Russian-530-908-0721.

The Winters Senior Commission on Aging will need to select a liaison to the YCCA as Chairman Glenn Ripley resigned as liaison.

b. Winters Senior Foundation

The Winters Senior Foundation gave out a record 50 Santa Bags to local seniors during the holiday season and will participate in the Big Day of Giving.

c. Winters Community Corazon / HAC

HAC did not meet. City Manager Trepia noted that the City Council formally approved transferring \$30,000 from the HAC account to the WCC philanthropic foundation.

## PROJECTS

a. Senior Resource Guide

The Senior Resource Guide is completed. The Commission Members discussed a system and schedule for updating the electronic version. Vice Chairman Whitworth noted what a huge accomplishment this project was, and the Commission discussed ways to market the guide including articles in the Winters Express, Facebook page, RISE, St. Anthony Center, in newsletters and on the City website.

b. Senior Center Fund Raising

The fundraising committee will resume meetings soon. A fundraising event, a casino night, will be held on Oct. 1 at the Community Center.

c. Senior Center Program Questionnaire

The subcommittee continues to distribute the questionnaire and compile results. They will present the latest responses at an upcoming Commission meeting.

d. Other subcommittee updates

The Committee discussed ways to encourage community members to participate in the SNAP program.

Commission Member Pearce gave an overview of AB 1400 (CalCare), which would create a state healthcare system and said he would come back to a future meeting with more details and to discuss writing a letter of support for the mayor's signature.
