* The City has authorized an early start to weekday work for construction in the tracts. When temperatures are forecasted to reach 95 degrees or higher, work may begin at 6 a.m. We've asked that back up beepers be turned off to the degree possible in the early morning. We've also authorized Saturday work for the next 4 weeks beginning no sooner than 8 a.m. for outside construction. The extra day will help the infrastructure teams complete their work before the



- rainy season (fingers crossed we have one) and to help catch up for labor shortages and COVID delays.
- ❖ Waste Management is releasing the next service schedule for July 2022 June 2023. Please note the City will be divided in half by Grant Avenue for brush collection and street sweeping so there will be a schedule for the north side of town and a different schedule for south of Grant.



- Also, waste collection and disposal costs will also be going up. Effective July 1, 2022, the annual rate increase for WM services will be approximately 3.5%. Notifications will be included in the next billing cycle.
- For a little good news, the new control panel for the pool heater is scheduled to be installed on Tuesday. Fingers crossed.
