- ❖ Yolo County Resource Conservation District & Office of Emergency Services has been working on developing a Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP). Please Note:

- ❖ Timed parking enforcement will begin again in the downtown area. Please be aware of time zones and other restriction, such as handicap parking and EV charging.
- ❖ PG&E is just about done with the work along Newt's Expressway. AT&T will need to pull their wire through the new conduit next and Wave will need to remove their wire as they decided to discontinue service for that block. Anyone who has wave on that side of Main Street adjacent to Newt's Expressway should select another provider. Once that work is done, AT&T will remove the poles. We'll share the schedule for this remaining work once we have it.



- ❖ PG&E has been flying helicopters to inspect lines today and will finish tomorrow, in case you were wondering who was flying around in the countryside...
- ❖ New drought regulations require that institutions turn off irrigation to turf areas, which the City has done around City Hall and the Community Center. Bubblers are still on for the trees. For water conservation information, please visit [Save Our Water](#).



COVID-19

- ❖ Please note we have several outbreaks of COVID in higher density housing with communal spaces. COVID is still here in the community, spreading and highly contagious. There are free test kits outside City Hall's side door and free masks in the library. Free testing is also available through the School District. If you have a runny nose, bad head aches or allergy like symptoms, please test. COVID may not knock everyone flat, but it could be more harmful to immune compromised, the elderly or others with underlying health conditions.
