I was an Army Officer for 10 years working with local, state, and federal agencies managing people, plans, operations, strategy, and emergency response. I earned an MBA from UC Davis and conduct financial, strategic, and data analysis in the healthcare industry. My wife, a teacher of 15 years in Winters, and I have a 4-year-old daughter.

Winters is a unique and special city that risks losing what draws us all to it if we mismanage the next 10 years. There are two issues this election that will shape all others: City Finances and Growth Management.

The past 10 years required reserve fund spending. We must rebuild our city general fund reserve before it is depleted, and continue responsible fiscal management.

With the last of the planned developments going in, how we manage the remaining infill space and planning for responsible future growth while preserving Winters' charm, will determine what our city will be: the close-knit community we all love, or urban sprawl of disconnected commuters.
